We were honored to be invited to participate in this competition, and Dr. Rick Lytle, Maria Kell, and Steve Mack were asked to be part of the judging panel. Listening to these students present their business concepts and plans was truly **INSPIRATIONAL**, and all who presented are winners in our eyes. The group called BOS PIGERY came away with the grand prize and we will be honored to sample some of their food on our next visit to Ghana.

2019 DID NOT DISAPPOINT. IT HAS BEEN AN AMAZING YEAR! HERE ARE SOME HIGHLIGHTS:



- HCC exceeds over 360 students and with 45 new students this October is close to exceed 400 students, which will occur in January 2020
- HBI exceeds 110 current students and commissions 37 new ministers during the 2019 ceremonies.
- The Professional Development School, partnering with ICM-UK, has over 70 students
- HCC celebrates its first graduating class with 30 graduates in front of an audience of more than 500 people including media coverage from 8 National TV broadcast houses, several radio stations and newspaper reporters.
- The Center for Entrepreneurship, Philanthropy and Ethics (CEPE) continues to build its reputation in Ghana as students start and incorporate their businesses. HCC leadership are encouraged by reviews from Ghanaian examiners who praise the CEPE for its unique and exciting contributions to the growing economy and for providing new employment opportunities via startups, many of whom are already employing people.
- Dr. Twumasi-Ankrah and team presented to the Barnabas Group in San Diego and Orange County.
- Alex Asmah becomes Doctor Asmah having graduated from the University of Cape Town (UCT) and successfully defending his doctoral work, and presented to the BAM Conference at Lipscomb University.
- We enjoyed witnessing several more students accepting God's invitation and being baptized.
- The Governing Council of HCC honored Daniel and Ruth Ampadu-Asiamah for their pioneering work in establishing the Church of Christ in Accra and the Accra School of Peaching, now Heritage Bible Institute (HBI), an integral part of HCC today.
- HCCF hosted 21 people on our 1st group trip to Ghana where we all participated in the inaugural graduation and a tour of Ghana's western region.

These are just a few highlights from a busy year, now we look to 2020 and ask for God's blessings as we pursue our role in His Kingdom; to develop capabilities that enable Ghanaian and West African Christians to be prepared to become Servant-Leaders in His Kingdom.
