Heritage Christian College began as a dream project for Dr.
Samuel Twumasi-Ankrah, then a graduate student at Abilene Christian College, in Texas. In 2002, two years after his graduation, Twumasi-Ankrah arranged a partnership with ACU to support the development of HCC, a Christian University to be conceived in Accra, Ghana.

A church member of the Nsawam Road Church of Christ, Twumasi-Ankrah's home congregation in Accra, bought the land that would eventually become HCC's campus, while church members from the United States contributed to breaking ground on the campus' first concrete block buildings. The vision to create the flagship Christian University in Africa was becoming a reality.

In 2009, HCC began the process of seeking accreditation for offering business and bible degrees. In the spring of 2015, HCC was accredited to offer Bachelor's degrees in Theology, Information Technology, as well as five different business administration degrees. The initial freshman class was admitted in the fall of 2015, with expected graduation dates of Spring 2019.

Today, HCC is celebrated as an institution set on exposing students to technologies and learning environments that will prepare them to create their own opportunities, uplift Africa, and become strong, Christian leaders in their communities.
