HBI AND ITS NEW DIRECTOR

MEET ALEXANDER MAXWELL YAWSON

Alexander Maxwell Yawson, until his appointment as the new Director for **Heritage Bible Institute**, was the Coordinator for the Winneba Study Center of Heritage Bible Institute. He is the preacher for the Winneba Central Church of Christ. Alexander completed Heritage Bible Institute in 2005 with a degree in Christian Ministry. He also holds a Bachelor of Arts in Basic Education from the University of Cape Coast, and a Master of Arts in Christian Ministry from Abilene Christian University.



Alexanders' desire for ministry was inspired by the several leadership roles he played in the church. Through his leadership, the Winneba Central Church of Christ has ordained elders and deacons, expanded its missionary activities and assumed a very challenging role of supporting and strengthening churches within Ewutu Senya Municipality of the Central Region and beyond.

Alexander has been instrumental in advancing the work in campus ministries, prison ministry, and many churches in the Upper West Region. He has been a guest on a number of radio stations to share and discuss social issues from the Christian perspective. Alexander was very instrumental in setting up the Heritage Bible Institute satellite campus at Winneba.

For those of you not overly familiar with HBI, here is a brief description taken from the webpage at HCC (www.hcuc.edu.gh). 'The Heritage Bible Institute is an in-house preacher training program for the churches of Christ. Since it was established in 1982 as the National Bible Institute, the Institute has trained over 500 gospel preachers and missionaries who are actively working in Ghana, Benin, Mali, Cote D' Ivoire, Senegal, Uganda, Liberia, South Sudan, Burkina Faso, Guinea Bissau and Equatorial Guinea and Nigeria. Year on year, HBI also organizes special training for elders, deacons, Bible teachers, women and youth leaders. HBI has satellite campuses across Ghana, including the main campus in Accra, there is Winneba, Koforidua, Saboba, Yendi, Tema and Assin Fosu (designated).

Heritage Bible Institute currently offers the following programs:
Foundations in Biblical Studies: Two years Part-time
Intermediate Studies in Ministry: Two years Full-time or three years Part-time
Advanced Studies in Ministry and Missions: Four years Part-time
Young Scholars Bible Training Program: Two years Part-Time for tertiary students and young professionals.
